

Background Information


- Utilization of our Brooks schools reached near full capacity for fall of 2024, after posting of Capital Plan
- Amendment to Capital Plan submitted
- Advocacy to City for provision of land
- Municipal reserve land provided
- Zoning decision made by Council in late fall
- Considerable community support to secure land, zoning decision, and recognize community needs - Thank You!!
- Resulted in capital funding announcement for "Planning" in March.
- Initial meetings with province indicated support to move forward rapidly to full building capital funding.



Project Overview

This building is designed for **635 students** to accommodate the future growth of Brooks across the new building and our current sites. This increases the capacity of CTR students in Brooks from 1310 to 1945. The current enrolment for all CTR Brooks school is 1384.

The St. Joseph Collegiate project encompasses **5719 m²** of new space, including the gym and specialized classrooms, supporting our commitment to community engagement and educational excellence. The combined size of the existing Christ the King Academy & St. Joseph Collegiate is 6409 m².





Enhancements

Alberta Education provides 690 m² gymnasium for a 635 student high school.


CTR is committed to provided an additional 160 m² for a gym expansion to improve student learning experiences and programming, with a total of 850 m².

Other enhancements may include outdoor upgrades and opportunities for community contributions.


